


5-Page guidelines for paper reviewers in 9 easy steps



Alerts that require my attention

Alerts are used in EasyChair to attract your attention to something that requires your response. They are normally created as a result of actions of other people. For example, when somebody asks you to make a review, a subreviewer alert will appear amongst your alerts.
For nearly each of these alerts, you can remove them either by making your response to the alert or simple dismissing the alerts without a response.
You alerts are shown and explained below. Follow the "view" link to view or respond to them. If you do not want to a particular alert at all, click on its "dismiss" column.

Abstract:	Background. Studies have identified that reading for pleasure (RfP) greatly influences reading behavior and is more important for academic success than family socioeconomic status (SES) (OECD, 2010). RfP can play a significant role in promoting literacy development in low SES areas although it is a contested reading concept in Thai society where reading is traditionally associated with academic purposes. Objectives. This paper is based on selected results from a PhD which has the following objectives: 1) to identify the factors affecting RfP reading promotion practice in community libraries (CLs) in the Northeast region of Thailand, and 2) to determine how these factors affect RfP reading promotion practice in community libraries in the Northeast region of Thailand. Methods. The research applied a multiple case study design. Data were collected through semi-structured interviews, unobtrusive observations, and documentary analysis. In this paper, the theoretical lens used to explore the data is Krashen's Free Voluntary Reading (FVR). Results. The paper identifies two strategies that CLs can use to encourage RfP among disadvantaged people in the disadvantaged Northeast of Thailand: 1) increase the provision of reading materials, and 2) provide literacy development support. Contributions. This research is the first to use Krashen's theory as a lens through which to explore the role of community libraries in Thai society and contributes to our knowledge and understanding of the application of FVR concepts in a non-Western context. In addition, the research has the potential to contribute to practice by demonstrating that CLs and RfP have the potential to be effective mechanisms for enhancing reading behaviour in deprived areas in developing countries through helping overcome inequality in book access and through support of literacy development.
