Our Dean, Assistant Professor Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn, was invited to give a keynote address on "Buddhist Studies and Buddhist Practice" at the International Conference on "Buddhism Across Asia: Networks of Material, Intellectual and Cultural Exchange" on February 16, 2009 at the Orchard Hotel, Singapore. The conference was organized by the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies, Singapore, and chaired by Ambassador K. Kesavapany. The conference comprised 4 plenary sessions and 11 parallel sessions ran across four

CU Website ranked No. 112 in the world and No. 19 in Asia

According to the latest global ranking of the most popular university websites conducted by www.4icu.org or "4 International Colleges & Universities" which assesses universities on the criteria of website reliability and updated data, CU was ranked No.112 of the world's 200 most popular websites, followed by Khonkaen University at No.160 and Mahidol University at No.182 respectively. In terms of the regional arena, CU scored No. 19 on the list of Asia's 100 most popular university websites.
