Thus, it was both pleasant and logical to continue the tradition: On February 15, 2013 H.E. Ana Maria Ramirez, the current Ambassador, paid a courtesy visit to the Faculty of Arts to discuss the feasibility of further collaboration between our Faculty and the Argentinian Embassy, and to strengthen the existing ties between the two institutions. Assistant Professor Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn gave a welcome speech to the Ambassador and presented her with a token of friendship. Present at the ceremony were Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn, Deputy Dean for International Affairs, Ajarn Dr. Nunghatai Rangponsumrit, Head of the Spanish Section, Ajarn Dr. Pasuree Luesakul, and Ajarn Dr. Penpisa Srivoranart, both from the Spanish Section.

To mark the occasion, H.E. Ana Maria Ramirez together with Dean Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn presided over a special talk on “A Socio-Cultural Perspective on Thai-Argentina Relations” delivered by Prof. Ezequiel Ramoneda, a researcher from Argentina. The lecture, co-organized by the Latin American Studies Center and the Section of International Affairs, took place in Room 304, Maha Chakri Sirindhorn Building from 10 to 12 a.m. A good number of students and faculty members attended the special lecture. After the talk Dean Dr. Prapod hosted a lunch in honor of H.E. Ana Maria Ramirez at the Crystal Jade Restaurant. ✿

On January 8, 2013 at 10:30 a.m., His Royal Highness Prince Khairil Imran, the son of the King of Malaysia, and his Consultants paid a visit to the Faculty of Arts. Assistant Professor Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn, Dean, Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn, Deputy Dean for International Affairs, and Ajarn Dr. Nureeda Hayiyakoh from the Section of Malay gave a courteous welcome to His Royal Highness and the delegates from Malaysia. The Dean also humbly presented an emblem of the Faculty and a token of friendship to His Royal Highness Prince Khairil Imran.



The Prince inquired about the curriculum of the Faculty and expressed his interest in enrolling in some courses. Addressing the specific interests of His Royal Highness, Associate Professor Pornrat Damrhung, Chairperson of the M.A. program in Dramatic Arts, Assistant Professor Sankavat Pradithpongse, Deputy Dean for Student Affairs and Director of the Academic Service Center, and Ajarn Dr. Thosaeng Chaochuti from the Department of Comparative Literature joined the discussion and gave detailed information about courses in the Intensive Thai Program, in Dramatic Arts, and Comparative Literature as well as about various courses offered in the BALAC Program. Taking the nature of the courses and the profile of His Royal Highness into account, the Consultants have been developing suggestions and an ideal package for him. After the meeting Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn took Prince Khairil Imran and his Consultants on a brief tour of the Maha Chulalongkorn and Maha Chakri Sirindhorn Buildings.



MOU Signing

Not only Chinese, but also Indian administrators are becoming increasingly aware of our Faculty. On February 7, 2013, an Administrative Team comprising seven professors from Jain Vishva Bharati University, India, came to visit the Faculty of Arts to establish formal relations between the two universities. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed by Assistant Professor Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn and Assistant Professor Dr. Samani Aagam Pragya on behalf of Professor Dr. Samani Charitra Prajna, Vice-Chancellor, Jain Vishva Bharati University in the newly-decorated room of the Arts library, Maha Vajiravudh Building. Witnessing the MOU signing ceremony were Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn, Deputy Dean for International Affairs, and Associate Professor Dr. Soraj Hongladarom from the Department of Philosophy. The MOU lasts five years, from February 2013 to January 2018.

The kind gift of valuable and rare books to the Faculty, given by Assistant Professor Dr. Samani Aagam Pragya deserves special mention and illustrates the significance of the occasion, which went beyond mere administrative discussion. To Guangdong University, our Faculty of Arts is a highly esteemed destination -- after all, when an administrative team from the Chinese institution visited on September 27, 2012, the delegation consisted of a whole range of top staff: the Vice president, Prof. Yong Heming, Prof. Li Huanrong, Director of the MBA Center, Prof. Hong Yong, the Dean of the School of Mathematics and Computer Technology, Prof. Lai Qing, and Mr. He Xiongwei, Deputy Directors of the School of Information Technology and the Human Resources Department, respectively, and Ms. Yang Chun, Head of the Section of International Affairs. To do this justice, Guangdong University's administrative team was welcomed by an equally distinguished group from the Faculty of Arts, namely Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn, Deputy Dean for International Affairs, Ajarn Dr. Chanyaporn Parinyawuthichai, Head, Section of the Chinese Language, Ajarn Dr. Hathai Jia, and Assistant Professor Dr. Suree Chunharuangdej.

In her welcome address, Associate Professor Surapeepan Chatraporn, to lay the groundwork, combined an overview of the Faculty's history with an introduction to the administrative structure. Prof. Yong Heming, Vice President of Guangdong University, in turn explained the various schools of Guangdong University, as well as their particular areas of expertise and specialization. Chula's Chinese Language Section with its curriculum was illustrated in detail as well, by its faculty members, all of which led to discussion about definite possibilities and benefits of future collaboration and exchange.



Assistant Professor Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn, our Dean, and Associate Professor Dr. Prapin Manomaivibool, the founder of the Section of Chinese Language and also the Director of the Asia Research Center, hosted a lunch for the Administrative Team from Guangdong University and the faculty members of the Faculty of Arts at the Montien Hotel, where the Dean and the Director presented tokens of friendship to their Chinese counterparts.



A Mini Seminar with Waseda University
