History


The Faculty of Arts, Chulalongkorn
University, is one of the country's
most distinguished institutions in the
humanities. It was established in 1916
when the university was first founded
by His Majesty King Vajiravudh,
in accordance with the royal wishes
of His Majesty King Chulalongkorn.
Originally combined with the
Faculty of Science, it later became
an independent faculty in 1954,
and in 1957, teacher training
programs were separated into
the Faculty of Education.

As the first institution in Thailand to offer systematic teaching and research in the humanities at the higher education level, the Faculty of Arts holds a significant role as the pioneer in providing a variety of courses that cover languages, both Western and Eastern, and other disciplines like linguistics, history, philosophy, geography, library science, and dramatic arts. For this reason, it stands as the premier institution in Thailand for producing academics in the humanities.



The Bachelor of Arts Program in Language and Culture (BALAC)

The Bachelor of Arts Program in Language and Culture (BALAC) is Chulalongkorn University's flagship global liberal arts program and Thailand's first cultural studies program. Since 2008, it has equipped numerous students with 21st-century humanities skills, knowledge, and experiences to help them succeed in today's world.

BALAC offers three concentrations: "Global Cultures," focused on the cultural impacts of globalization, "Media Cultures", focused on the relationship between various forms of media and culture, and "Foreign Languages," focused on a third language along with the relevant cultural contexts.

Graduate Programs in Thai Studies

Since 1991, the Thai Studies Center at the Faculty of Arts, Chulalongkorn university, has received students and visiting scholars from various countries all over the world. The Center offers master's and doctorate programs in Thai Studies aimed at fostering multidisciplinary research on Thai Studies and bringing traditional knowledge to a wider audience. As the only institution in Thailand that offers international graduate programs in Thai Studies, the Center holds a vision of Thainess that transcends both geographical and disciplinary boundaries. This vision is reflected in the courses provided by the Center and in graduate theses that adopt multidisciplinary approaches or explore Thai subject matters in global and regional contexts. The Center places equal emphasis on vigorous scholarship and immersive first-hand experience of Thai society and culture. Our Thai Studies educational activities exceed the confinement of the classroom and library. Excursions and field trips are provided on a regular basis to



enrich students' actual experience of Thailand.

Lifelong Learning Courses and the Academic Services Center

The Academic Service Center offers, for the interested public community, language training courses from beginner to advanced levels covering 14 languages (English, Italian, Spanish, French, Russian, German, Portuguese, Japanese, Chinese, Korean, Hindi, Pali-Sanskrit, and Burmese). Apart from courses on essential language skills necessary for communication, there are also specialized language training courses tailored for specific purposes, such as exam preparation, work-related language skills, legal and literary translation, selected topics on the culture, history, folklore of different countries, and more.

The center also provides lifelong learning courses focusing on the development of various soft skills, including creative thinking, mindfulness, self-awareness, critical thinking,

cultural awareness, and digital literacy. The courses are offered by different departments within the Faculty of Arts and can be transferred as credits towards degree programs. These soft skills are hallmark traits of graduates from the Faculty of Arts, distinguishing them in various professional and academic fields. In today's rapidly changing world, these skills are not only valuable but essential for success and adaptability.



The word "Sawasdee," a commonly used greeting in Thai society today, was coined at the Faculty of Arts in 1933 by Phraya Upakit Silapasan, a Thai language Master who is recognized as an important figurehead of Thailand.



Research

Research at the Faculty of Arts encompasses a broad spectrum of topics, aligning with the specializations of our professors. Supported by funding from the Faculty's Research Division and national and international organizations, our projects and publications, which include articles, book chapters, and books, make significant contributions on both national and international fronts. Furthermore, Faculty staff actively oversee the publication of four journals, recognized nationally by the Thai Journal Citation Index (TCI) and internationally by SCOPUS, namely *Journal of Letters (TCI 1), Thoughts (TCI 1), Thai Language and Literature (TCI 2), New Voices in Translation Studies (Scopus Q1) and Manusya (Scopus Q2).*

The Faculty hosts various Centers of Excellence (CE) and Research Units (RU), where interdisciplinary research is developed by professors from different departments. Examples include

- Center of Excellence in Southeast Asian Linguistics
- Center of Excellence in Translation, Interpreting, and Intercultural Communication
- Center of Excellence for Science, Technology, and Society
- Center of Excellence in Geography and Geoinformatics
- Applied Linguistics for Language Education Research Unit
- Arc of Memory Research Unit
- Corpus Linguistics for Digital Humanities Research Unit
- Dramatic Arts and Innovation Research Unit



Notable research projects from these Centers of Excellence (CE) and Research Units (RU) align with Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and international cooperation, engaging local communities and striving to achieve heritage conservation.



- The Moklen Project is undertaken in collaboration with Moklen communities along the Andaman coast, with the goal of documenting and archiving their endangered language and culture. This effort includes proposing an orthography for the Moklen language, creating a Moklen-Thai-English dictionary, and developing an online archive dedicated to the language and culture of Moklen communities.
- Nan's Digital Manuscript Repository for Safeguarding our Cultural Heritage and Enhancement of Local Economy focuses on the preservation of centuries-old palm-leaf manuscripts scattered across temples in Nan Province. This project involves experts in geography, information studies, and fine arts working on preservation, digitization, and social innovation using technology to unlock the secrets of Buddhist doctrine, traditional knowledge, and folklore.
- The Arc of Memory Research Unit researches and curates cultural memory and heritage. In collaboration with the Digital Archive of Modernized Siam and its international network for mobile archival digitization and platinum printing, it preserves endangered archives of historical documents, photographs, negatives, and architectural designs with museum-quality digitization. In 2025, it plans to open a Digital Archive of back to the late 1800s, to the public.



International Affiliations

The Faculty of Arts has formed alliances with countries and universities across the globe. With the multifaceted interests and expertise of our students and staff, these international partnerships have fostered diverse and productive collaborations in the form of exhibitions, events, festivals, workshops, seminars, and conferences as well as our highly active student and scholar exchange programs.



Exchange & Visiting Students

Through MOUs with various universities worldwide, we proudly host international exchange and visiting students interested in spending a semester or a year in Thailand. Our academic programs offer a wide variety of

courses, including Thai language courses for international students, while our convenient location in the city center offers vibrant, enriching experiences.



Visiting Scholars

We welcome academic contributions of our visiting scholars through collaborative research, instruction, and projects, among other opportunities. Chulalongkorn University also offers grants covering travel, accommodation, and monthly expenses for qualified visiting scholars with over three ISI or Scopus publications within the past five years.



Department of Thai

The Department of Thai is one of the oldest departments in the Faculty of Arts, dedicated to the mission of cultivating teachers and researchers in Thai language and literature with profound knowledge across the country. Presently, it offers courses to exchange students majoring in Thai from diverse countries, covering language skills, culture, and literature, all taught in Thai.

The Center for Thai as a Foreign Language (CTFL)

For more than three decades, the Faculty of Arts at Chulalongkorn University has been providing an extensive array of Thai language and culture courses tailored for foreigners with diverse objectives, be it academic enhancement, business endeavors, or personal enrichment.



Our Center offers a multitude of programs catering to the requirements of individuals seeking to learn the Thai language. These include the Intensive Thai Program, Communicative Thai for Beginners, Reading and Writing Thai, Academic Thai for Advanced Learners, Thai for Mandarin Chinese Speakers, as well as private classes tailored to both individuals and groups. Moreover, the Center also provides a variety of courses at different levels to international and exchange students who are keen on learning basic to advanced level Thai.

Last but not least, our Center also offers a summer program for international participants who wish to learn more about Thailand and its rich history and cultural heritage. The program is designed around 4 lecture series on Thai history, Thai society, Thai language and literature, and Thai culture (festivals, food, and music). The classes in survival Thai introduce the participants to the enjoyment of communicating in the colorful Thai language. For hands-on experience, workshops on popular Thai cuisine, art, and recreation are provided. The program also includes trips to famous

landmarks in the city of Bangkok and an overnight stay at a seaside or historical province. The summer program in Thai language and culture will enrich your experience and make your visit to this vibrant tropical country a memorable one.






On-Campus Dining: A Culinary Exploration

Chulalongkorn University International House (CU-iHouse) is a purpose-built, 26-story residence designed to accommodate international students and visiting faculty. CU-iHouse offers 846 fully furnished units equipped with air conditioning, modern amenities, and a robust 24-hour security system. Additionally, residents benefit from the convenience of easy access to the University's main campus through the shuttle bus service. Furthermore, this university residence boasts a strategic location in close proximity to the vibrant street food zones of Samyan and Bantadthong, allowing residents to enjoy diverse culinary experiences.
